### Mijomboni Orphanage

Both sides of the ocean are extremely excited about SBC making it's first visit to the Rescue Center! Please be in prayer for Matt Maxwell, Billy Bell, and Kyle Parks October 7-13 as they travel and meet our partners in Kenya.

Nathan shared that they had a visit from the health department in September and were asked to immediately make a secondary latrine and enlarge their kitchen. These projects were unexpected but were completed in good order along with the addition of a new poultry house and a new goat house. The former poultry house had been turned into a classroom.

Inflation continues to cause issues with the feeding program. The price of sugar has sky-rocketed. The tomato harvest (right) was very good and helped to spread their financial resources.









Elsa Akech is the new teacher. She is a trained P1 teacher, and has been teaching in the Kibera slums in Nairobi. She has been with the Center for several weeks and is proving to be an excellent teacher and a good fit for the students.

Nathan is still hoping to purchase an irrigation system to further the ability to produce food for both the Center and the community. The cost is \$2,300 and we raised \$900 of that through the gifts of Vacation Bible School! We have also received a gift of \$30 from a community individual, and a \$100 donation in memory of Betty Moore so we are hoping to raise the balance of \$1,270 before the end of the year.

And please put your extra change in the Change for Change Plinko box in the foyer! We are \$77.71 shy of our \$300 goal for the year which provides a sponsorship of one child for a year.

We would like to share just a little of what our beloved retiring pastor has led us through in his 32 years of serving us, just in case you weren't blessed to be walking beside him in those years.





• We went from this building on the left, complete with bats in the belfry, to our current building. In his time at SBC, Steve led the congregation through the multiple renovations of the old building frontage, the Family Life Center, and the completion of our new Sunday School and

Discipleship space.

• We took our first international mission trips to Africa, Honduras, Guatemala, and Ecuador under his guidance.

 Our ministry in the community has increased a hundredfold through his leadership. We have collectively served in these community ministries over the years: Whitney Young, AWAKE, homeless ministry, Men's & Women's Shelter, SIMPly

Love, Operation Care, Serenity Center, Colonial Hall, Shelby Touched Twice, Simpsonville Fall Festival. His personal relationships with our community members and his availability to just chat or to give a little therapeutic advice, is such that it has become an earmark of his character. He also coached a large number of community t-ball and softball teams!

- We went from Operation Christmas Child boxes, to Kentucky shoeboxes, to EKY shoeboxes to the Christmas Toy Store under Steve's leadership.
- Began and grew Contemporary Worship service
- While pastor the church began and grew following legacy ministries: Adventure Club, 2 Hispanic church plants, A Loving Choice Pregnancy Center, Kenya orphanage, Community Ministry Center, built one church in Honduras and helped build one church in Guatemala.
- Built \$2.2M Multipurpose Family Life Center and \$4.3M Multipurpose Educational facility
- Church purchased four parcels of land (\$700K) to support growth of ministry
- Developed church to six full-time staff and dual budgets of \$1.7M
- Four individuals from the church went into full-time ministry/missions
- Church grew to give \$100K annually to support Christian missionaries worldwide

#### **Fun stuff**

- Steve & Gerri raised two beautiful daughters here, although we will need to resort to Facebook to see the basketful of grandchildren grow up!
- When we started our first Bunco group it took a year for him to approve it, but he finally gave the ok and it has brought so much joy to our ladies.
- We started serving coffee! Despite the fact that Steve doesn't drink it, he saw the value of fellowship via the coffee cup.
- He led us through the trauma of Covid that came with all the drama of shut-downs and masks.
- He married and baptized hundreds of us, our children, our grandchildren.
- We went online with our worship services and his teaching is now accessible world-wide!
- He allowed us to dance in church with the first Father Daughter Dance in 2013.
- We began having our annual church family Thanksgiving dinner.



In closing, looking at the young Steve Boyd and the 32 years later Steve Boyd-there is not much difference and very little gray hair. Which really means that we as a church have been a delightful part of his life!

# BY THE II

The Kentucky Baptist Convention years run from August to August and we recently completed our Annual Church Profile.

For the year we had: 15 baptisms and 21 other additions. These could be by statement of faith or transfer.

NUMBERS Our total Sunday School enrollment was 299 with an average of 161 attending. That is 65% which is above average for KY

Baptist Churches. Our average Worship attendance was 249.

Our Cooperative Program giving was \$91.017.00. \$5,243 was given to the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missionaries. \$7,839 was given to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missionaries, and \$3,000 was given to our local Baptist Association.

### **Did You Know?**

ALC Pregnancy Resource Center raised over \$40,000 with their recent Baby Bottle Campaign. SBC donated a total of \$1,648.16.



# Growing selfless Tots


### **GROWING SELFLESS TOTS BY Kim Laureen**

Parenting is not for the faint-hearted and raising children in this age of technology brings with it many challenges. Gen-Z was the first to never have known life without iPhone in hand, internet, and social pages. Now we are experiencing a tsunami of anxiety and narcissism. We can't be sure yet what the future holds for toddlers on screens - but it's a scary thing. As people fall deeper into the meta-verse it becomes even more crucial for parents to hold on to interactions of the human kind with their children. This four-part study series is based on the award-winning documentary selfless. Come along as we explore planting roots, how blue light is affecting the eyes, social media influencers, and the value of Growing selfless Tots. Parents your children learn from you and look to you from their very beginning. Perhaps its time to ask yourself - what do they see?

### God's Heart to Eradicate Trafficking by Safe House

Sex trafficking has one of the greatest footholds on humanity. Every year, hundreds of thousands of Americans are trafficked every year right here in our backyard. Vulnerable girls, boys, women, and men, from the youngest child to the elderly. Less than 1% of those being victimized are ever identified.

In Matthew 16:13-20 we see Jesus declare his victory over this evil as he stood above the caves in Caesarea Philippi, known as the "Gates of Hades," where children were ritually sexually abused as part of pagan worship. In Matthew 16:18-20, Jesus says, "And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."



Above the caves where individuals were being trafficked, Jesus declared and decreed that it was on that rock he would build his church. Jesus did not allow one ounce of darkness to remain, but rather commanded his church to go on the offensive against the greatest manifestations of evil in our world. That declaration has not changed. Jesus is still commanding us to build his church, empower believers, and operate in the power of the Holy Spirit to attack the gates of Hell. He has given us the ability to humbly submit ourselves to Him, act in obedience to His calling, and through the wisdom and discernment of the Holy Spirit, be given the divine strategy to face human trafficking head-on.

We will hear several testimonials from different speakers, most notably from Sarah, one survivor of Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking. Sarah is Safe House Project's Survivor Content Creator. She has been working in the anti-trafficking movement for the past 3 years, having spent the last year with the Safe House Project. She sits on the board for a state survivor's council, has been a consultant for several nonprofits in the field, and is the author of 2 books. Every day she works toward eradicating sex trafficking so that no child has to endure what she did as a child.

Come with us on this journey to understand God's heart to eradicate trafficking, to see the captives set free, to see people healed, and to see revival in our land. Will you join us?
