#### **Accepting People, the Way God Intended it**

Does anyone desire our church better reflect heaven in her worship, fellowship, and ministry? Would you like to see our church embrace people from all social/economic strata, all racial/ethnic backgrounds, and from all redeemed pasts?

Jesus had NO prejudice toward social, economic, racial, ethnic or sexual distinctions. Jesus invited and accepted social outcasts, disabled, mentally challenged, prostitutes, lepers, tax collectors, demon possessed, shepherds, adulterers, and murderers into his Kingdom and church. How do we measure up?

I can hear you saying, I accept everyone. There's a big difference in saying we accept everyone and being intentional inviting and including everyone in our circle of friendship and church. I can hear you saying, but Jesus changed all of those people. Yes, you are right. BUT you are wrong, if you think He didn't love, help, and accept them before He changed them. We should too. This topic makes some nervous because they suppose this kind of movement would change their church. It would change our church. Jesus says it would change our church for the better.

If we accept His mission by embracing people outside our normal social arena, then we must also embrace their story and journey. Our stories and journey are rarely perfect and sometimes downright messy. We all have some spiritual warts. However, for God to work in our midst, we must confess our past journey to God and to one another for Him to shine His light in our darkness and for us to experience victory.

Would anyone in our church leave because someone of different social/economic status began to attend? I sure hope not. The need to leave would possibly be some pain or anger that God wants to address in your life. He can bring healing and peace with our past, but can we accept people with a past?


Some possible signs you may feel this way are as follows:

- 1) you won't welcome them into your social circle
- 2) you won't welcome them into our church and small groups
- 3) you don't want your children mixing with their children.

What do we hold in common? We all were once rejected. "But God commended in His love for us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died on the cross for us (Romans 5:8). We all must show fruit of repentance. For them? Yes. For us? Yes.

Seeing people the way Jesus sees and welcomes them is a work of grace, not judgement. Simply put, Jesus showed compassion and love. "When He saw the crowded, he had compassion on them,

because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Matthew 9:36).

#### **Hispanic Ministry**

We have a Hispanic ministry that has been meeting at our church since the first week in October. It was planned to begin with a small group Bible study of around 20, but quickly grew to around 40. They now have a full worship service, an interim pastor, a band, and a student Sunday School class. Their worship has a sweet and welcoming spirit.

They are beginning to look at organizing as a Baptist church by calling a pastor and leadership, plus developing a budget. SBC offers our building and copier for their use. They currently don't need keys to the building. Our church will discuss becoming a sponsoring church through the Kentucky Baptist Convention. The KBC has offered to provide some money to help the Hispanic congregation get started for the first few years. To be a sponsoring church, we commit to help support them with worship and small group space, even during construction of our new building.

#### The Hispanic congregation will worship with us on Sunday, February 27, and we will celebrate our partnership in the gospel.

Their congregants come from Guatemala, Cuba, and Mexico. Most of the congregation speaks English adequately to have a conversation. They currently have 10 students and 6 children that attend our public schools.

The church meets on Sunday at 1pm in our Fellowship Hall. Please feel welcome to visit them for worship. We are praying for a couple of people from our church to be liaisons between our two churches. Let's continue to pray for our Hispanic brothers and sisters.





#### Mijomboni Orphanage

We were very excited to have 6 additional children join the Rescue Center in Mijomboni, Kenya. It is a great blessing that these children are two groups of

siblings. Alvin & Emily Mweni are 7 & 8 yrs old. Both of their parents died from AIDS and they were being cared for by a grand-mother with eleven of her own children. Emily has been sponsored by Gary & Edith McGowan and Alvin has been sponsored by Jerry & Laura Miller.



The Kombe children, Victor (12), Jackson (10), Chris (8) and Khadija (6) have also come to the center as a result of both parents dying of AIDS. Victor has been sponsored by Dale & Sharon Kramer; Jackson has been sponsored by the K.C. Tingle Family; Chris has been sponsored by Lowell & Linda Ashby, Khadija has been sponsored by Duvall Burk.

Despite being successfully managed in the West, AIDS is an epidemic in Kenya-most especially along the coastal areas which is where the rescue center lies. The disease is found in all age groups. Currently it is estimated that there are **over 3 million orphans** in the country, 47 percent orphaned as a result of HIV and AIDS. And many of those who are born to mothers with AIDS will be born with AIDS. The country is hard at work developing programs for those affected, but poverty plays a massive role in being able to access the programs and medications. The Center provides health care for all of the children, and for those affected by AIDS, it's a game-changer in their health care alone.

Despite the sandy ground, the garden is doing well!

Shilla is picking vegetables for dinner; the children will learn how to grow and raise their own food.
