

Confession of Sin...the Way God Intended.

Confession is the appropriate response of both the convicting and the glorying ministry of the Holy Spirit. First,

our rightful posture of confession comes when we embrace the truth that our sin separates us from God and His purpose. We are simply convicted of sin and humbled to confess. Secondly, confession responds to the truth and testimony of the Holy Spirit that God is perfect, holy, and just. We desire to see, respond, and confess His glory, the very attributes of God.

It's a good day when we are aware of our sin. Psalm 51:4 says, "For I know my transgressions and my sin is always before me." We should daily confess our sin to God. Our relationship to the Lordship of Jesus and yielding to the Holy Spirit are indicators and signs that we desire to please and honor God in all we say, do, and think. When we sin, we hurt our relationship to God. When we remain in sin, we withdraw our availability to God and the Holy Spirit is grieved and quenched.

The Bible further teaches in James 5:16, "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed." It's a great day for the church when we can talk freely about our sin without judging one another. The appropriate posture for the church and the confessor is to embrace the truth spoken with grace and love. Of course, there are always consequences of sin, and we can learn to see punishment as a good discipline and correction. As we mature, we give thankfulness for God for humbling and breaking our spirits before Him and others.

Churches don't teach and talk enough about confession of sin. To grow to spiritual maturity, we must confess our sin in prayer before God. Confession daily postures us correctly before God. Why don't we confess our sin to one another? It's because of the pride of exposing our sin and the distrust of one another as to how we will be treated.

Confession brings healing from sin, guilt, shame and embarrassment. We must bring our sin out of the darkness (secrecy) into the light (God and other believers). Confession will not only give us freedom but also provide healthy accountability for our sin from trusted and loving faith family.

Annie Armstrong Offering for North American Missionaries



Building Team Report

The Buildiing Team is excited to report that the drawings have been reviewed by the team and currently in the permitting process for review. Teams are being formed to select interior finishes. The steel manufacturer has given a tentative delivery date of mid-September. Currently this would allow for a start date of 1st of August to be ready to receive and erect the building. You will start seeing construction for the temporary entrance that will be through the door located at the end of the nursery hallway. To date this year, we have spent \$11,398, consisting of the loan closing and contractor costs, including permitting. Looking forward to getting the finalized schedule from the contractor to provide more insight as the project progresses. Scott Sageser

Church Staffing Update

In July of last year, we looked at our children's and student ministry directory and knew we didn't have enough population in these areas to validate calling two full-time ministers. We also were cautious, not knowing if giving to operating budget would be sustained. We presented to the church a new full-time position called Family Pastor, and we are thankful that God has led us to Jesse Wright! Jesse, Rachel, James, Ella and Hannah will be moved here by April 1.

In September, Pastor Steve asked the Personnel Team to consider a new full-time position to lead in Adult Discipleship. The church in Ministry Meeting approved the position. That minister would be responsible for the following:

- 1) Develop a discipleship model encompassing new members, new Christians, young believers, growing believers, and mature believers.
- 2) Develop opportunities for spiritual growth that would include, but not be limited to, the following: Bible Basics; Discipleship classes for doctrine, ministry, service, etc; Spiritual gift inventory; Collaborate scope and sequence with other pastors for children/students.
- 3) Develop new Sunday School classes and Home Groups.
- 4) Develop a website presence publicizing all discipleship classes.
- 5) Create opportunities for adult teacher support and training.
- 6) Preview all teaching material for doctrinal integrity in accordance with the 2000 Baptist Faith and Message.
- 7) Collaborate with Men's, Women's, and Family ministry leadership.
- 8) Serve as staff representative on Property Team, Ministry Involvement Team, and First Impressions.
- 9) Support, oversee, and review office support staff and custodial staff.

Currently, the Personnel Team is interviewing for this position. Please continue in prayer that the Holy Spirit would lead the church and a specific person to this position.

THE GOD WHO ANSWERED HIS PRAYER



Mijomboni Orphanage Update

The Rescue Center has had a month of valleys and hilltops. They had a record number of children vetted to become residents. Unfortunately, it was discovered that government officials had been bribed \$20 to recommend children of colleagues who had both parents. The officials were in the process of creating fake death certificates for the each of the parents. This will give you an idea of the type of corruption that is present and that Nathan, our Administrator, deals with on a daily basis. It will also show the quality of the care that Center provides to the community; that parents would go to these lengths to have their children become residents speaks volumes. We are greatly blessed to have Nathan and Shilla at the helm!

Of better news is that one of our church families has sent several sewing machines to the center to help them begin a new tailoring class for widows and single moms in the community. Bricks are being made and an addition to the center is well under way.

Nathan sent this prayer need for a young man, David Mulla, who is struggling to pay

for his education. "Opening a door of a school is closing the door to the prison cells. Without education our rescue efforts will have no impact. A case in point is of young man David Mulla who scored highly in High School and was selected to join The Technical University of Kenya. Well wishers helped him to start his first semester, the second semester he has none to lean on and cannot continue his courses. If none comes to his aid, his life will be wasted, from what he writes to me, he may be ruined. Such cases turn to crime to further their life. One of his texts reads "if this situation continues, I may decide to terminate myself."

The Rescue Center is the first step to saving lives. However, the needs in this country are very great. From the story above we see how difficult it is to live if a young man sees suicide as the only option of not being educated. We thank you for your prayers and generosity on behalf of Ultimate Wings and the Orphanage.
