Update on Plans for Construction of Multi-purpose Educational Facility

For those new to our church fellowship, the multi-purpose educational building will consist of adult classrooms, church offices, Adventure Club office, student ministry area, and a large gathering area connected to the Family Life Center under one roof.

- * The project will cost \$3.414M plus furnishings.
- * Scott Sageser is the church project manager for the new facility.
- * We currently have three teams that are leading in the following areas: Furnishings; Technology and Security; Parking and Landscape.
- * The church approved a loan for these items up to \$900,000.


The demolition of the one-story building is still set for August. Work has been proceeding in clearing the Fellowship Hall/Administrative Building and storage areas around the church in preparation for demolition of the building. This plan will incorporate moving the Adventure Club offices and the church office between June 15 and July 1 to Rooms 102 and 103 on the first floor of the FLC. This will allow about a full month to close the one-story building by removing fixtures and furnishings.


Plans are to move all ministries and Bible studies from the one-story building to either the Warehouse or the Family Life Center (FLC). We will have 9 different ministries meeting in the Warehouse during construction.

The temporary entrance into the Family Life Center for Sunday worship/Sunday School, offices, and Adventure Club will be through the north entrance closest to Highway 60. An entrance and walkway with appropriate protection will be built.

You will be given further information in the July newsletter about where ministries and classes housed in the Fellowship Hall will meet. We will have a place for everyone, but ask for your patience while the multi-purpose educational building is under construction. Please continue to pray for the construction of this building and that God would be glorified.



Mijomboni Orphanage Update

The Rescue Center has had some issues with some of the older girls misbehaving with boyfriends offsite. Due to the nature of their misbehavior, an investigation was completed by the local government and it was determined that the girls involved should be removed. Also, they determined that new rules regarding the ages of children be incorporated. Unfortunately, this new rule affected three innocent girls, who are now over the age limit for the orphanage, and they were also removed.

The wonderful news to share is that the rest of the children are really adjusting well. There is a long wait list for the orphanage, and several new children have already been admitted.

Robert is 5 yrs old. He is the son of a woman with AIDS who was chased from both her marital home and her parent's home. Robert has four more siblings. **Emmanuel** is Robert's brother.

Oscar is 8 yrs old and has been abandoned by both mother and father. He has been surviving by moving from household to household in the community.

Edgar is 10 yrs old. His mother remarried and Edgar's stepfather rejected him. In order for her to stay with her new husband, she was required to get rid of Edgar and he was dropped and disowned. Edgar has been Oscar's comrade in the streets and villages.

Global Prayer Needs for June

- 1 India-Pray for the 150 news churches planted in unreached areas.
- 2 **Eritrea**-Pray for a Voice of the Martyrs radio ministry that reaches Eritreans.
- 3 **Comoros**-Pray for new believers, who are persecuted and ostracized when they come to faith.
- 4 North Korea-Pray for Minji, whose husband was killed for his faith.
- 5 **Kyrgyzstan**-Pray for revival in the country.




You were created to play, engage, adventure, and explore—with others. Because while the ache of loneliness is real, it doesn't have to be your reality.


