Much excitement is building with the anticipation for the start of building a new two-story 19,000 sq ft multi-purpose educational facility. Our one-story administration/fellowship hall building is being

deconstructed with the removal of furnishings, fixtures, flooring, kitchen, HVAC, etc. We should be completely out of the building on July 1, enabling final details to be accomplished.

Building Decommissioning July 24

The Administration/Fellowship Hall multi-purpose building has been a great blessing to SBC since 1988. The church has done many types of ministry, discipleship, fellowship, and worship in this building. The building brings many fond memories and blessings for many of us. We will have a brief recognition and thanksgiving for the blessings of this building in worship on Sunday, July 24. **Yet, we believe the Holy Spirit is leading in a bold, new vision by building a new facility where the same ministry functions and new ministry strategies can be done on a broader scale.**

New Multi-purpose Educational Facility

Through this new facility and vision, we will welcome many newcomers as well as re-engage our existing congregation. If you are new to our church family or have yet to return to your previous level of participation, this could be an exciting new season. If you are a new attendee or new member, your involvement is integral in our desire for Kingdom growth. We open our arms to you all!

The new multi-purpose educational facility will include adult classrooms, large student ministry area, staff offices, Adventure Club office, adult classrooms, and a larger gathering area with small kitchen, coffee bar and seating. The new facility will not only be available for these congregational gatherings, but also community needs. The expected date of completion is in April or May, 2023. The following is a schedule for the month of July.

Demolition of Administration/Fellowship Hall Building Details

- Week of July 18th - Placement of temporary barricades
- Week of July 25th - Utilities disconnect in Admin/FH building
- Week of August 1 - Demolition begins

Church and Adventure Club Office Location

- Church Office: Room 103 in Family Life Center
- Adventure Club Office: Room 102 in Family Life Center
- Ministry Staff: Various Rooms in Family Life Center

Plans are to move all ministries and Bible studies from the one-story building to either the Warehouse or the Family Life Center. We will have 9 different ministries meeting in the Warehouse during construction.

While seeing a new facility built will be exciting, we ask for your patience as we share space and move to existing space. As we experience a few growing pains through this expansion, we can all choose to be flexible, to show grace to each other, and to focus on the gospel of Jesus being shared and lived out. We will give the best service that we can with parking, building entry and exit, sharing space, and certainly safety. We humbly approach this time with thanksgiving, prayer, and anticipation of what God will do through hearts yielded to Him and His will.

Mijomboni Orphanage Update

Over the past year, we have shared many heart-rending stories of what our children at the orphanage dealt with before coming to the Rescue Center. Our first child was received back in November and in six months Nathan and his team are making great strides with the children. It has not been easy trying to mesh 40 children from differing backgrounds and trials. Here are some beginning success stories!

"These three girls, Jennifer, Vivian & Brenda, came at same time and it happens that they were in the same village.

They had no formal education background, they used to provide for themselves by moving around the village looking for used plastic water bottles for recycling. Unless they get a hundred of them, no pay-no food. They have really changed from the time they came in. It took them time to adjust to a restricted environment. They tried to escape many times; the reason being making their own money. School was not a factor to them.

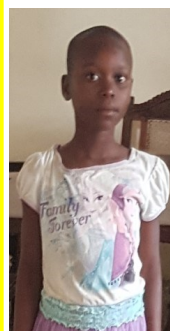
They love being in school, always thankful for everything they get in the Rescue Center. They can now read and write. They have settled and looking forward to a better future."

One of our sponsors received this note from Nathan regarding Chris.

"He is an orphan whose parents died of AIDs. He has three more siblings, one sister and two more brothers. He is supposed to be in grade two but because of his status of being an orphan, he has just started the formal education system. ***We are glad that he is catching up very fast. In fact his teacher could ask what to write, he says, she writes down his thoughts, and copies them in his own hand writing.*** For a starter in the school system, he is doing well. He is a quiet boy but has started playing actively with other children. Before coming to the Rescue center, he had never seen a mattress, toothbrush, and many other things for personal effects. This made him afraid when he first saw them to the extent that he was shy in using them.

Before coming to the rescue center, he and his other siblings, used to beg for shelter and food. Many times, they could move in villages to look for empty plastic bottles to collect and resell them to the juice vendors for a meal. We pray he will grow to be a Christian who will mentor others."

"Tunda Mzansu is in grade 4. Unlike other residents, Tunda sought her own admission. On the first day, she came with her father's death certificate. I didn't know how to handle her. I sent her to bring the next kin; she went home uncontrollably crying, never to come back on the appointed day. I really felt guilty of sending her away; we had to look for her till I got her in an alcoholic selling den, took her to the chief who assisted us.

She likes education, and loves all her co residents and the staff. She is a singer! Tunda is a promising child, her future is bright.

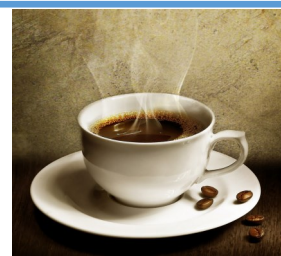

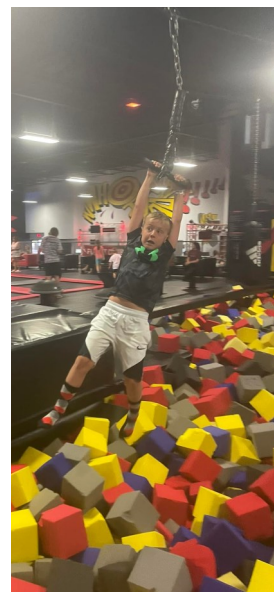
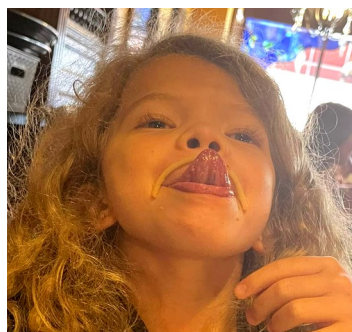

Deacon/Yokefellow Selection Procedure

Nominations will take place June 26-July 17

Deacon Selection will be August 14

Biblical & Church Requirements for Deacons and Yokefellow:

- All nominees should be in accord with 1Timothy 3:8-13.
- Must be a church member for one year and be involved in Sunday School **and** Worship regularly.
- Must exhibit growth in giving to a minimum of a tithe.
- Regularly attend deacon meetings and deacon ministry events. Deacons currently meet the first Sunday of each month at 4pm.
- Deacons commit to serving a term of three years and then must rotate off for at least one year.

Nomination Requirements:

- To be nominated, deacon nominees must be ordained or have served one year as a yokefellow.
- You may not nominate your own family members.
- You must be a member to submit a nomination.

Yokefellows:

- Serve in a mentoring role for one year and have the same nomination requirements and expectations as deacons.
- Nominations can be made for any individual within the church membership.
- Are not required to be ordained or to have served in the past.

**** Please note:**

- ⇒ All nomination forms and ballots must be printed **legibly**, otherwise they will be discarded.
- ⇒ Nomination forms can given to a staff member or placed in the offering plate.
- ⇒ Parents of children who are members, please consider the magnitude of this process and potential implication upon the outcome when deciding whether or not to allow your children to vote. **Children must be 16 yrs of age to vote.**
- ⇒ Members may nominate up to **two** deacons and **two** yokefellows.

Please do **NOT** nominate these deacons who are ineligible for nomination because they are currently serving or are rotating off for one year: *Matt Moore, Mary Wyatt, Chuck Rhoads, Marilyn Rhoads, Chet Miller, Byron Thompson, Cindy Childers, Edith McGowan, Brent White, Troy Fulkerson.*

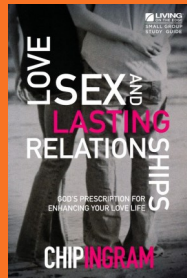

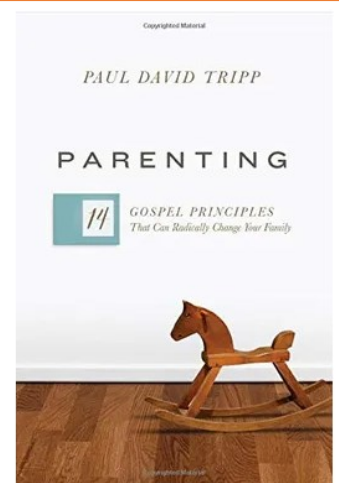
