

Book cost: \$16. Meets in Room 203.



#### Remembering the Past while Anticipating the Future

Simpsonville Baptist Church has built four buildings in her history and is beginning the fifth building in August. The buildings include the original church sanctuary on Main Street, the 1923 church sanctuary (demolished almost 5 years ago), 1988 multi-purpose building (administrative & fellowship hall), and the 2003 Family Life Center.

We celebrate the movement of the Holy Spirit in and through His church in the 1988 building for 34 years. Church buildings often hold much spiritual, mental and emotional experience. Such important attachments usually occur because of meaningful events. We have worked, studied God's Word, and fellowshipped TOGETHER in the 1988 administrative/fellowship hall building. Simply put, many memories abound...

Prayer meetings, Classic Worship, memorial services, marriages, deacon ordination and meetings, ministry meetings, administrative team meetings, tutoring, VBS snacks/crafts, student benefits and DNow, Student worship, marriage conference, baby showers, birthday celebrations, nursery, offices, adult classrooms, church and staff offices and more.

We now enter another historic moment for Simpsonville Baptist Church when we demolish one 4600 square foot building in favor of a new 19000+ square foot building. We are excited to begin construction on a new facility with these same worship, ministry and fellowship functions and events, but with more opportunity because of better space. It's appropriate that we give memory to the past while celebrating a new future of opportunity through a new building.

We must remember that a building is a tool for use, but the main element of the church is God's people exercising their Holy Spirit-given gifts to serve and to lead the lost to Christ as Lord and Savior. This has always been the purpose of the Church and we must pray that SBC will grow to embrace this as our first priority. Please pray for the worship, fellowship, and ministry of our church!

#### **One-Year Prayer Emphasis beginning soon**

With the construction of our new Multi-purpose Education Building beginning next month, the Bible Truth Seekers Adult Sunday School class is sponsoring/organizing a new Prayer Emphasis period for our church. This will be an opportunity for our entire congregation to participate in a year-long prayer emphasis scheduled for the 24-hour period on the 24th day of each month (Nehemiah 9:1-3, Hosea 6:6). This emphasis is scheduled to begin on September 24, but if enough participants sign up, we may want to begin on August 24.



Participants will sign up for time slots (15 minutes, 30 minutes, 1 hour, etc.) when they will dedicate this specific time to praying on the 24th of each month. A place will be assigned on our church property for those who wish to come to a specific place and time for their prayer commitment. (This is said to work better than just doing it at home or one's place of work, but wherever it works best for each person is fine.) A prayer guide and current list of prayer needs will be provided at that site for pickup for use during one's prayer time that month.

Begin praying now that this emphasis will become a needed part of your prayer life. One that finds a dedicated time to pray for our church family and your personal family. Both have many needs. In many ways, COVID has given us a break in routine, and now may be the best time to start new schedules and commitments. Look for more information coming in our newsletter, bulletin, e-news and announcements. Pray that you will be led by the Holy Spirit to join with others in seeking God's direction for our lives and for the life of our church more than ever!

#### **NEXT STEP TRAINING**

Next Step Training Program has had so many great things happening since the last update that I barely know where to begin! First of all, we graduated a new class on June 16th and celebrated with a pool party and potluck! Each student cooked something from scratch and brought it to the celebration. All of the families were able to attend and we had an incredible evening of celebrating the accomplishments of the students and sharing ideas for upcoming sessions!



Second of all, we now have 100% placement rate for our students! This means that every student took their next step! Some of them got jobs (The Forum, Stelised, Zappos, etc) and some entered college! One of our students is looking to change roles and we are in the process of finding him a new position that will help him develop new skills!

Third of all, the Simpsonville Farmers Market is in full swing and our current class of students have all participated! The customer base that we have built over the past 4 years have been incredibly warm and encouraging to all of our students as they gain customer service skills which as a general rule is not one of their strengths. They have all worked on getting out of their comfort zone and learned that talking to our amazing customers isn't so bad.

Fourth of all, we are going to have a pickleball tournament to benefit the program which is mainly funded through the Office of Vocational Rehab. This tournament will provide the needed funds to scholarship students who are not eligible through OVR, but who desperately need what God provides through our ministry!

Lastly, our fall session is set to begin on August 16th and we have enough students to form two groups! The growth is wonderful and manageable thanks to the Lord and His timing and leading. One of the groups will have students who are ages 18-20 and the other will have students ages 25-30 which makes it easier for each of the staff to tailor the class time toward the specific needs of the group.

#### Mijomboni Orphanage Update

We are very pleased to share that the children are settling down. We have received multiple reports about how well the children are doing. Nathan shared this update regarding Boniface, Juma and Chris-"They hail from different villages but have something in common, humility. Always thankful. They feel privileged to be in the Rescue Center. It took them time to accept using a mattress, they had not seen! They freely play with others. Juma Kwaka being a Muslim, is taking time to pray for others. They had no formal schooling, they are



now enrolled and enjoy school activities. Health wise, they have undergone a wonderful transformation, their hair has changed from brown to dark black. We are forced to

buy them new clothes because of the increase of their body size!"

Inflation is hitting the orphanage hard BUT they are growing most of what they eat and supplement with the goats and eggs.

We are very excited to s hare that our Vacation Bible School kids raised \$1,044.12 on behalf of the Rescue Center. This money will help offset the cost of rising prices in the area and will be used to help pay for an Administrator.

#### **Global Prayer Needs for August**

- 1 Jordan: Pray for a young mother held hostage by relatives for several weeks because of her Christian faith.
- 2 Afghanistan: Pray that our brothers and sisters will persevere through opposition and persecution.
- 3 Uzbekistan: Pray for more fellowship and collaboration among churches.
- 4 Lebanon: Pray for Christians whose houses were destroyed in August 2020 Beirut Port explosion.
- 5 Central African Republic: Pray for Believers who have lost loved ones and seen unspeakable violence.
- 6 Iraq: Pray for Brother Ahmed, a former Muslim who went missing in Baghdad in October 2020.
- 7 Nepal: Pray that laws designed to restrict churches will not be approved.
- 8 Algeria: Pray for Christians whose churches were closed by the government.
- 9 Sri Lanka: Pray for those ministering in Buddhist-controlled areas.
- 10 Tunisia: Pray for Christians who are isolated by distance from other Christians.
- 11 China: Pray that God will provide protection and mercy to those in difficult circumstances.
- 12 Eritrea: Pray for the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of recently released prisoners of faith.
- 13 Kenya: Pray for a Somali Christian family who returned to their community to share the Gospel.
- 14 Laos: Pray that village leaders will follow the law that allows people the right to become Christians.
- 15 Egypt: Pray for Ali, whose father tried to kill him when he became a Believer through a satellite tv program.
- 16 Oman: Pray that Muslim seekers will come to Christ after reading distributed Bibles and Scripture portions.
- 17 Bhutan: Pray for an increase in youth engagement with the Gospel.
- 18 Kuwait: Pray for the protection of Kuwaiti believers, who are meeting in increasing numbers.
- 19 Turkmenistan: Pray that new church leaders will replace pastors who fled the country.
- 20 Syria: Pray that the many Christian converts from Islam will grow in knowledge and faith.
- 21 United Arab Emirates: Pray for a woman and her children hiding from family because of their faith in Christ.
- 22 Somalia: Pray for the families of Somali believers who had been killed for their faith.
- 23 Indonesia: Pray for pastors facing financial crises, especially those who rent worship space.
- 24 Uganda: Pray for the courage and safety of Christian converts from Islam who are now sharing the Gospel.

Sylvia Hinton, daughter of Brent and Karen Hinton, is spending much of her summer serving as a summer missionary. Idul Adha is the Islamic holiday where Muslims offer a spotless or a good goat/lamb/cow to allah. After sacrifice, there is a weighty emphasis to share the meat with the poor.

"The celebration <u>starts on Saturday night</u>, July 9th, with the last call to prayer of the day continues all night long with special prayers. The next day, Sunday, July 10th, Muslims will rise up early to kill their animal and offer prayers. Then, it is time to cook and prepare for friends and family to come over to feast.

A week ago, KK invited a couple and I to come and experience the holiday. KK made us food to eat and we sat around the table and talked for hours. In many of our conversations we had, KK explained the origin of the holiday which comes from the

story of Abraham and the almost sacrificing of Ishmael. In the Islamic belief, the chosen line is through Ishmael, not Isaac. Amy, JD (her husband), and I were able to ask questions and have the opportunity to retell the story of Abraham and Isaac while discussing the good news."



#### Adult Growth & Discipleship Update

The Bible teaches that the church's primary job is to make disciples. Jesus was very clear in Matthew 28:19-20 (NKJV): "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit ..."

In the Biblical sense, all Christians should be disciples just like we should all be ministers, servants, missionaries, etc. But Jesus also said that being a true disciple isn't easy. Listen to Jesus' words in Luke 9:23 (NIV):

"Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

Our goal in discipleship is to utilize Community Spaces and Learning Spaces within the Church to move us toward a greater level of commitment and to becoming more and more like Jesus. These spaces include Sunday School, Small Groups, Men's and Women's Ministries, Core Classes (doctrine, theology, etc.), Bible Studies (how to read the Bible, the story of the Bible, books of the Bible, etc.), Spiritual Habits (Prayer, Evangelism, Serving, Missions, etc.), Family Support, and more.

It's almost August and Summer is flying by! Before we know it, Fall will be here and school will be starting back. Our new Sunday School Year is about to start, and our discipleship programs will be starting up soon. I hope you will plan on being part of our great Sunday School Program as well as our men's and women's Fall studies:

Take a step back into the historic Steamboat Era. This beautiful 1894-built Mansion is a 22-room marvel built in the Richardsonian Romanesque style. It was the home of the famous Howard steamboat building family of Jeffersonville. The collection features original furnishings, brass gasoliers, stained glass windows, intricate carvings throughout and a magnificent black walnut grand staircase replicated from a famous steamboat. Master craftsmen from the family shipyard created much of the exquisite decor features in the mansion. Howard built steamboats included, the luxurious J.M. White, the speed record-holding City of Louisville and the popular Indiana. Models, photographs, paintings, half-hull models, tools, and other amazing historic artifacts abound in our unique Jeffersonville museum.

## Spiritual Intimacy 3 Ways to Forge a Stronger Marriage

On my second date with my wife, our relationship hit its first speed bump: ordering pizza. She loved veggie pizza; I couldn't pick broccoli out of a lineup. Awkward, even for the server, who had to give us "a



few more minutes" 17 times. Years later, we realized we'd each experienced a silent "uh-oh." It all worked out, thankfully—these days we compromise with supreme.

We're often desperate to forge a connection with our spouses, scared to death our interests will diverge and our marriage will crumble. We tend to think the deepest bonds between people are formed by shared interests, likes and dislikes. We worry if those passions change, we'll grow apart. As Christ followers, though, we have an unbreakable connection with our spouses: the Holy Spirit. Therefore, spiritual intimacy forges the deepest, most significant bonds between wives and husbands, because our spiritual lives make up the core of who we are. Spiritual connections create stronger intimacy than shared vocations, hobbies, or senses of humor. Since our relationship with God can always grow, that means our marriages can, too.

## 3 ways to grow spiritual intimacy in your marriage 1. Get real.

Are you able to be honest with God? To open up and talk to Him about what's really going on in your life? That's the first obstacle to hurdle in your path to spiritual intimacy. Your spouse can be your greatest help, but do you feel safe communicating that to them? Sometimes we need a different form of communication to open up. A letter or text might be a better way to express difficult things. You can write it in an hour or over two weeks, look back over it to see if you're communicating clearly, and even ask a friend to give it a glance. You might even "prime the pump" by expressing your fears and needs off the bat in a separate letter to lay the foundation for a helpful conversation. If you're still struggling, the way forward may be to enlist a trusted friend, pastor, or counselor to help. Tell them the struggle you're facing and ask for help to open up with God and with your spouse.

#### 2. Listen well.

Sometimes, when my wife shares how she's doing with God, I get into fix-it mode. Instead of listening and empathizing, I tell her how to solve her problems. Ugh. We create safe-sharing opportunities by committing to listening well without judgment or advice unless it's specifically requested. We can create that space by modeling that posture and politely asking for it. My wife reminds me of this by saying, "Babe, can I process something with you?" That language tips me off that it's not problem-solving time.

#### 3. Connect with God together.

Once you're ready to build intimacy with God and with your spouse, why not kill two birds with one stone and do it together by praying? Being honest with God and your spouse and asking Him to draw you closer together seems to me like pouring rocket fuel into your Honda's gas tank. Reading the Bible together can also be a great connector, but fair warning: For me, it was a bit of a learning curve. I began our marriage thinking I was supposed to lead my wife spiritually. That's true, but what does that really mean? In year one, I thought it meant knowing the most and being the best. Instead of learning together, I was attempting to teach and impress. Needless to say, those early times reading the Bible together fell flat. Sara wanted a confidant, not a Bible study leader.

The leaders in our lives aren't the ones who tell us all the answers or lord knowledge over us. They invest in us, care about us, and sacrifice for us. I usually have to take what I've assumed about leading my wife and flip it on its head—ask her advice, admit I don't know an answer, confess my shortcomings. Here's a crazy thought—I should ask her what she desires of me in a leader! Only took me a shade under a decade to figure out.

#### A Vision of Flourishing

The prophet Ezekiel experienced some tough times. He saw the violent exile of the Israelites from the Promised Land because of their unfaithfulness. To encourage Ezekiel and His people, God shows him a beautiful vision in <a href="chapter 47">chapter 47</a>: a trickle of water that grows into a wide, tree-lined river. That vision of flourishing reveals God's plan for our relationship with Him, growing into eternity. That's God's dream for our marriage, too. As we knit our hearts to God more and more, we're drawn closer to Him and closer to each other. Whether we've been married for a week or half a century, growth is possible. More intimacy awaits as we focus on our relationship with Jesus.

And I know that in your marriage things might not be great right now—you might be struggling, drifting apart. There's hope, though. Adversity has been the heat that forges intimacy for my wife and me. As we've moved toward Jesus together in whatever situation we've found ourselves, fear fades away as our hearts knit together and we know that nothing can tear us apart.

Not even pizza toppings.






#### **Hello Simpsonville Baptist Church Family!**


