Kingdom Life by Steve Boyd

YOU NEED GOD'S PEOPLE, THE CHURCH!

It is not a Biblical option to omit the Church from your life if you are a Christian! You may make it an option, but it's not Biblical. You may think you can do okay walking alone as a Christ follower. The Bible says a growing Christian can't be isolated from doing life with mature Christians or you will most likely lose your purpose and desire to grow spiritually in His likeness and to be used for His Kingdom service. You need the encouragement, influence, and accountability of other spiritually mature believers. The grave problem some professing Christians have is that they attend a church on Sundays but never experience any life change or transformation. How can that be? One can do that because you aren't participating in Christian fellowship with other mature believers.

What is this fellowship of our confession of faith? It's more than talking about worldly topics of work, sports, and fun. "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bead and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give the anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincerely hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved (Acts 2: 42-47).

Do you hear the theme of doing Christian life together and pouring into one another spiritually? Everyone needs a Timothy and everyone needs a Paul. This means you need to give yourself in Christian fellowship to someone spiritually less mature than you and you need to walk with someone more spiritually mature than you. You need other mature Christians to grow to be used by the Holy Spirit in His Kingdom.

This fellowship of blessing that the Bible encourages is found mostly in small groups and one to one discipleship. "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another and all the more as you see the Day approaching (Hebrews 10:24-25).

What will I lose if I don't desire Christian fellowship? First, you may not be saved and going to heaven. Second, you will be stunted spiritually because you miss one of the greatest resources God gives us, His people. Third, the Church is the organism that is most important, not you. We need one another desperately!


Your commitment and involvement to the "body of Christ" is the plan for Kingdom growth and for your personal spiritual maturity. Without the Church, you may be lost in worldly ambition and your life in disarray because His

purpose isn't being fulfilled in you.

God's will for you is to be in spiritual fellowship and unity with His people, the Church. Notice that the Church isn't a building but a people. The people have the common bond of love for God and a desire to serve and honor Him daily through His power and resources. Is that the goal for which you are striving?

I've recently been with two individuals. One said, "because we don't go to Church doesn't mean we don't believe." While that may be true to an extent, how do they believe and who is the Church in their life? The other said, "I want to live but if He's ready for me, I'm ready to go." The problem is this person has never or rarely been involved in growing in His likeness with God's people, the Church.

We need God's people! The Bible is clear that the Church is to be an organism whereby we are encouraged, influenced, and account to one another for Christian spiritual growth and usefulness.



KY Baptist Disaster Relief Given to date:\$2,105

Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief volunteers have put up some astounding numbers in the first two weeks of response to the flooding in eastern Kentucky.

Here's a glance at a few:

3,539 volunteer days

17,320 meals served

1,908 showers provided

1,800 loads of laundry cleaned and folded

138 flood recovery jobs completed

256 gospel presentations

39 professions of faith

The one number most important to each of them is the 39 professions of faith to have come through while serving during the worst flooding in Kentucky history. It is devastating for the flood survivors but the hope that is brought to them from those wearing the yellow shirts and helping them in maybe the worst moment of their lives is heartwarming.

KYDR volunteers do the work – mudding out a home, cleaning up mold and mildew, tearing out floors and removing water-damaged furniture. They cook, wash clothes, and provide places for showers. They also counsel those who have lost everything, they cry with them, listen to them and share the gospel when the door opens. While there have been 39 salvations, the gospel has been presented 250 times – seeds of salvation for another day. They have also handed out 462 Bibles, even more seeds being planted. After each project, they meet with the homeowners and present them with a signed Bible, talk with them and ask if they would like them to pray. Sometimes it opens the door to sharing the gospel.

Ask any of the volunteers what their favorite part of working with Disaster Relief is and the answer will be the same: when someone accepts Jesus. They talk about bringing hope and healing when going on any disaster scene and it is not just talk. They look for opportunities to share the gospel. By Mark Maynard, Kentucky Today


Project Read-Simpsonville Elementary Begins Friday, September 30 8-9am

Mijomboni Orphanage Update

Our little orphanage is gaining the attention of many in the community due to it's high programming and organization! Recently, they had a visit from a German woman, Dawn Goebbels who has been running an orphanage in the Watamu area for the past 15 years. She was interested in doing some networking and was very impressed by the discipline of the children and the itinerary of the daily activities. We are slowly gaining recognition by the community leaders.

Here is an update from Nathan which includes a daily schedule.

"Last year we started poultry project with a view of providing food in the rescue center and teaching our children on responsibility. We are excited to let you know we have had an increase in flock. We no longer buy poultry products in the market. This project has saved us in terms the cost. We also engaged the gardener in planting vegetables like spider plant, night shade,



beans, green grams, egg plant, males, and okra. These are supplementing our way of bringing up these children. The bigger ones are literary engaged in planting and watering the plants. We want to teach them when they are young. We are also planting citrus fruits, papaya, cashew nuts and mangoes."

Schedule

"As per our objectives of raising up well-rounded children, religion is at the center of our activities. On a daily basis, the children are up by 6am with cleaning and making up their beds. Before breakfast, they are taught Bible stories. At the table for breakfast, one of children, leads the rest with a prayer for food and guidance for the day. This continue for lunch, dinner and evening when they retire for bed. Bible stories are done with their teacher and cook. On Satur-



day, they have school activities until noon, and after lunch they are starting to train in singing. On Sunday mornings, they participate in Sunday School lessons. After 9am we occasionally invite various pastors from area churches to teach or more often, I lead them myself."

Togetherness: Couples Living Life Better Together


You desire to have a healthy marriage full of love, enjoyment, care and intimacy. You can create that kind of marriage and make it your reality. If you have a willingness to learn and

Yet as John Piper teaches in this series and its companion materials, God has designed us for far more than this. We just have to awaken to the simple, biblical reality that "to live is Christ, and to die is gain."

Designed to be used in a ten-session, guided group study along with the companion components in the kit, each fifteen-minute presentation explores the meaning and significance of making one's life count for eternity. Piper's rich teaching is a useful tool any leader or facilitator can use to direct members' understanding and guide them to treasure Christ above all.



Me & My Identity by Sid Koop

Everyday teenagers buckle under the pressure of trying to figure out who they are. They are in an ongoing inner battle to discover their identity. How do I

form my identity? What informs who I am? What if I don't like who I've chosen to be? Or worse, what if my friends don't like me?

Rather than tell you how to answer the question "Who am I?" we reframe the question to be "Who does God say I am?"

Together we realize that the pressure is off, because we do not need to create our identify, we get to discover it in Christ. An identity, that is grounded in the great love and intention God expressed in creating us with purpose.



24-hour Prayer on 24th Each Month

Prayer is relationship with God not just a list of needs and concerns articulated. It's an avenue of seeing God working in the daily life of His children. During the construction process of our new building every member will have opportunities to serve in our prayer ministry. In Nehemiah, chapters 8 and 9, is the process used during the rebuild of the wall around Jerusalem. Using this model our congregation will conduct a 24-hour prayer time. Each person will have an opportunity to sign up for a time during the 24-hours on the 24th of each month. Praying onsite is optional, but a dedicated place is preferred even if at one's home. (*Places may change from month to month due to space availability.*) Notebooks expressing monthly prayer needs will be available to assist you in directing your prayer time. This ministry is a work in progress and will take-on new emphasis monthly.

An information meeting will occur on August 24th at 7:30pm in Room 201.

This ministry involves everyone. Parents, teach your children the importance of prayer by praying with them during this time. Singles, couples, seniors, become involved in this powerful service to God and SBC.

Prayer is to be practiced in order to see God working and ways in which WE must become involved. When we are in "one accord" God shows His great power. Everyone should have some time during the 24-hours monthly called prayer meeting to pray together. Sign-up today.
