



### Change is Always Coming!

Change is continual. We consider some change good, and some change bad. We have a mobile and global world that affects change in our homes, jobs, schedules, and church. The world has had a steady wave of health issues (whether agreed on or not) that have nevertheless impeded the flow of life, basic needs, and basic services. Then there's the change of moral life in America, mostly spiraling downward. This moral decline caroms into the church in diverse ways.



In many middle and small sized churches, there has been a faster and unusual

change of attendees and members in the last 3 years. The stress of trials has created a perfect crucible of challenges heated with emotions that can create a mix of character defects, withdrawal, isolation, and other harmful effects. In the Christian life, we call change spiritual birth and sanctification. We know that change to God's vision in a cultural context is good change. We know that a church growing in holiness, obedience, and evangelism is good change! There are so many examples of good change!

While we don't change in our allegiance to the Lordship of Jesus or to His Word, we will have to adapt to trials and challenges that come to us in an ever-increasing manner as we approach the Last Days. These sinful and cultural changes and challenges aren't new to churches and families across the ages. The catalysts of change through the centuries may be different, but the response of faith should be constant. How can the local church survive and even flourish despite the changes and trials caused by the spiraling down of morals and convictions without and within?

Simpsonville Baptist can respond to guaranteed change in at least three humble and gracious ways. First, SBC is a people of like faith who are a spiritual community pouring into one another with love, prayer, truth, accountability, and more. Your biggest horizontal, spiritual support shouldn't only be the pastors of the church, but your small group that does life together. The small groups of a church should be the front line of support and care in times of trials and change.

Second, a strong local church must develop leaders who are resilient in faith during the times of challenge or trial. Spiritual leaders step up and lead in truth, grace, wisdom, prayer, and love. In most local Baptist churches, these leaders generally have or are currently serving as deacons, teachers, and ministry team leaders. In some manner and level, the leaders should have a following and a spiritual influence to reassure, sustain, lead, and grow the church. Leaders lead by knowing and following God's Word and being led by the Holy Spirit.

Third, your commitment to your faith family is carried by a mutual spirit of love, community, mission, truth, prayer, worship, evangelism, and spiritual growth. These spiritual disciplines are each person's responsibility to receive and cultivate in your life. While all churches will have their trials and challenges, it's not a Biblical option to remove the church (God's people) from your Christian life.

What is your commitment to the faith family, the Body of Christ, known as Simpsonville Baptist Church? Your commitment should be Biblically grounded in the Holy Spirit calling and leading you to participate in this family of believers of like faith. Your commitment is to be fortified by the Holy Spirit leading in understanding the importance and strength of faith and community. Christ and His church is enough, and you must keep your participation and commitment to the local church as paramount to God's will for your spiritual welfare and use. Continue to pray for Simpsonville Baptist Church and God's mission through her.

Truth4LIfe Sunday School Class hosted a Christmas party, including dinner for the 58


residents of Colonial Hall Personal Care Home. Each one of the residents

received a personal gift which they had requested. T4L also sponsors a child at the Mijomboni orphanage.

<u>Faith Works Sunday School Class</u> adopted a family from a local apartment and provided all the ingredients for the perfect Christmas including a grocery gift certificates and presents for the children.







**Two years ago** we started to tell you about the needs in and around the little town of Mijomboni, Kenya. We shared horrific stories of unwanted children being burned with hot water when born, children selling themselves for meals and sanitary supplies, and toddlers left alone all day because parents had to work. We appealed to our church family to help build a rescue center and you responded with great enthusiasm. After a little over six months the center was built, and we were beginning to locate the most needy children.

We have had some ups and downs since opening...parents wanting so desperately for their children to live in the center, that they arranged for fake death certificates and older children not following the Christian principles that enable the center to run smoothly.

**Today** we can share with you that the thirty children which live at the Rescue Center have truly experienced life change. Those who gave to see the building of the Center, and those who give now to sponsor the children have literally saved the lives of thirty children.

In October we received report cards for the children who attend school at the orphanage. Although some of the children are still struggling, others have responded and have done so well, that they have surpassed their counterparts in the school system. In November we sent another payment to finish the floors. As of December all the floors had been finished and they now have concrete steps. We provided a Christmas party for the children and bonuses for the staff. To give you an idea of the bonuses, the three employees received a total of \$30 in bonuses-\$10 each. The Christmas Party was a celebration of food, not toys. The Christmas wish list included: a goat to be slaughtered (\$50), a

bundle of wheat flour (\$30), 10 liters of cooking oil (\$30), onion, tomatoes and other vegetables (\$50), sodas and fresh

juice (\$50).

### Accessing our online community


Church Community Builder (CCB) is a tool to help you get better connected with your church family. You will be able to match names to faces of people you don't know, get contact information and connect with groups which you are involved in.

- Request a login from the church office (angie@simpsonvillebaptist.com).
- Once you log in to the online community, you will land on your personal home page. The page contains information specific to
  you including: a welcome message from the church, your profile box with contact info, a list of your groups. You can change
  your privacy settings, family photos and contact information. You can

add birthday and anniversary information.

### To view other Profiles

To view a profile for another person, click the People tab on your profile page. (If you do not see a People tab it means you have a limited access profile and will only be able to see your profile. Limited access profiles are changed to full access profiles once you have attended for six months.) After clicking People, begin to type a name in the search box. You can use a first or last name. As you type the system will automatically narrow your results. Click the name of the person you would like to view and their profile and information will come up. Security features might be enabled depending on the individual.



#### **To view Groups**

• You will see groups to which you currently belong on your profile page. You can also go to find Groups using the Group tab and using the search engine. Once your group is opened you will see the list of those included in each group. You can also search for new groups and request information about any group.

There is also a Help button located in the top right hand corner on any page if you need assistance with your personal profile or group info or just managing the Church Community Builder website.



### Habits of Purpose for an Age of Distraction

The Common Rule is a set of daily and weekly practices designed to form us in the love of God and neighbor.

### Love Of God

Look at the habits as they pertain to love of God. You were made to love and be loved by God. Only in the light of his love will you finally see who you really are, feel how you are supposed to feel, and

### Love Of Neighbor

When we think of better habits, we often think about our own self-improvement. Nothing could be further from the purpose of the Common Rule. These habits are meant to be practiced with others for their sake.

#### Embrace

Embrace is a reminder that there is much good in the world God made. God's presence-not his absence-is the primary fact of the world. That we need each other-not that we harm each other-is the primary truth of being human.

When we practice resistance, we acknowledge that evil and suffering are very real, though they aren't how the world was made to be. But remember that resistance has a purpose: love. The habits of resistance aren't supposed to shield you from the world but to turn you toward it.

### The Weekly Habits

One hour of conversation with a friend -We were made for each other, and we can't become lovers of God and our neighbors without intimate relationships where vulnerability is sustained across time. In habitual, face-to-face conversations with each other, we find a gospel practice; we are laid bare to each other and loved anyway.

Fast from something for 24 hours - We constantly seek to fill our emptiness with food and other comforts. We ignore our soul and our neighbor's need by medicating with food and drink. Regular fasting exposes who we really are, reminds us how broken the world is, and draws our eyes to how Jesus is redeeming all things.

Curate Media to Four Hours - Stories matter so much that we must handle them with utmost care. Resisting the constant stream of addicting media with an hour limit means we are forced to curate what we watch. Curating stories mean that we seek stories that uphold beauty, that teach us to love justice, and that turn us to community.

Sabbath - The weekly practice of sabbath teaches us that God sustains the world and that we don't. To make a countercultural decision, we should stop our usual work for one day of rest. Sabbath is a gospel practice because it reminds us that the world doesn't hang on what we can accomplish, but rather on what God has accomplished for us.
