God's Blessing of Worship


How does God resource His church for strength of mission, purpose, and Biblical unity? To be effective we must realize God has equipped His church with spiritual disciplines to be lived daily. In the previous two months we have looked at the blessing of the Bible and Christian fellowship.

Next, God had mandated that we worship Him. The Bible says, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching" (Hebrews 10:25). The Bible teaches that we need one another and are interdependent for God's will in our church and lives in 1 Corinthians 12:12-27.

God has blessed us with worship to intimately relate to Him through faith. What are some examples of true worship?

- True worship enters His presence in worship with a spirit or posture of humility, confession, thanksgiving, adoration and submission.
- True worship is giving reverence and thanksgiving to who God is and what He has done for us through our Lord Jesus.
- True worship culminates in deeper faith and commitment to His Kingdom, church, Word, and mission.
- True worship strengthens us to deter sin, selfishness, and worldliness.
- True worship teaches us healthy spiritual disciplines and accountability that cause us to grow spiritually in Christ.
- True corporate worship gives a living testimony and loving accountability of brothers and sisters in Christ to

strengthen and encourage us to grow in the image of our Lord Jesus.



What are some examples of false worship? False worship goes through the motions of rituals that have perhaps lost their meaning and believe showing up for worship credits our account for good works.

- False worship tends to be selfish and consumer oriented.
- False worship wants the message and music to make us feel good or entertain.
- False worship is showing up without engaging the Scripture, submitting to the Spirit and making fresh commitments
- False corporate worship makes no connection to daily worship and living. False worship is showing up but not being changed in our life.

We must also cultivate private worship (devotion) to the Lord Jesus throughout the day. It's more than a half page devotion; it's a daily walk with Jesus through the spiritual disciplines where we are conscious of His presence, direction and calling. Developing the spiritual discipline of "walking in the Spirit" will enable us to trust and obey Him.

You cannot live the Christian life without corporate and private worship. The battle against Satan, the flesh and the world will consume you and you will fail. "Come let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker (Psalm 95:6).

For the past 30 years, Operation Care has offered help, hope, and healing to hurting people, through Jesus Christ and with the financial assistance local churches, including SBC and a host of generous people. They provide the community with a transitional housing program for women and children; a state-licensed medical and dental care program at Operation Care Mercy Medical Clinic; a prescription drug program at the clinic; food pantry; emergency assistance program which provides food, clothing, and home furnishings to people facing catastrophic loss from flood, fire, or financial crisis; and the Community Christmas program, working in conjunction with other community partners to provide Christmas gifts and food baskets to families in need. None of these services would be possible without financial supporters, volunteers, and donations and purchases at our Encore Shop Thrift Store.

You can help Operation Care serve the community by **donating** your slightly used clothing, household items and furniture, children's clothing & toys, school supplies, seasonal goods, heavy blankets, etc. or financially.

You can also **volunteer** your time to help in the Encore Shop by arranging clothing, dusting housewares, creating displays, cleaning floors and windows, and building maintenance.

Adopt a room in the Housing Program. Each time a resident moves, paint, clean and/or prepare the room for the next resident.



Mijomboni Orphanage Update

Nathan sent this note regarding an update on the children's schooling:

"Last year we partnered with Baguo primary school for our schooling program besides our teacher complimenting on the same at the Center. **The student** population has soared from in Baguo from 1350 students last year to 1720 this year! Despite a student population increment the number of teachers has remained the same. The number of classrooms has not been increased. I have requested the management of a private school near here to partner with us. We will have all our children taught in our residence with our teachers, then they will go to this private school for National examinations. This arrangement will save us a lot. Despite the fact that public primary education is free, we were being asked to pay \$40 a year per child which was increasing to \$60."

Nathan purchased desks for their lessons and cubicles to hold their books and materials.

SBC Fun Facts

- Our Worship attendance average so far this year is 256. Our Sunday School attendance average is 179.
- We have 254 people listed on our Enews address book, Our highest ever percentage of opened Enews was 76.8% which was in February of this year. All of our opens are in the USA with the exception of three who are in Sweden and one in the Netherlands!
- Our RightNow Media free subscription service to Bible studies and videos for all age groups has 158 people listed with 86 (54%) participating. If you are one of the 70 that are not enjoying this great resource, call the church office and we will resend your invite!

Each month we are highlighting one of our incredible Sunday School teachers.

Teacher Spotlight: Rick Taylor

How long have you been teaching Sunday School? My late wife Bea and I taught elementary SS for 3 years, then we started the Vineyard Class about 2005, so about 21 years.



How did you get your start teaching SS? Bea and I knew we needed to be more involved, teachers were needed (much like now), so we volunteered to teach the children.

What do you like most about teaching? It's out of my comfort zone, so I know it comes from above. I rely on Him more because of it.

Describe your teaching style? I'd say I lead more than teach. Our class is good at open discussion but I try to keep it on the scripture presented.

What is the name of your class? Vineyard Why did the class choose that name? When Bro. Steve asked Bea and I to lead our class, most of us had not been involved in a SS class as adults. So Bea bought books for the class entitled "In my Father's Vineyard" which was based on John15, and followed the writers own experience in his father's family vineyard. When asked what we wanted to call our class, we all agreed, The Vineyard Class.

Tell us about the makeup of your class. (age range, number of people etc.) If everyone could be there (we have some illness), there are about 34. Currently we range in age from 19 to 90. 17 men, 17 women; 6 single/widowed, the rest married.

What would you tell potential visitors to your class? Be prepared for an informal class, lots of transparent sharing and discussion, a bit of teasing and joking, a closeknit family of believers with lots of life experience.

What are Resurrection Cookies?

The process of making Resurrection cookies is a wonderful way to share the Easter story.

Each step and ingredient of the recipe represents a part of the story and the final product.

The cookie, is a representation of the empty tomb that was found on Easter morning and the meringues cook so that the middle of the cookie is hollow.

To be made the evening before Easter. You need:

1 cup whole pecans, 1 tsp. vinegar, 3 egg whites, pinch salt, 1 cup sugar, zipper baggie, tape, Bible, heavy wooden spoon

Preheat oven to 300 degrees. This is important! Don't wait until you're half done with the recipe!

Place pecans in zipper baggie and let children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested, He was beaten by the Roman soldiers. **Read John 19:1-3.**

Let each child smell the vinegar. Put 1 tsp. vinegar into mixing bowl. Explain that when Jesus was thirsty on the cross, He was given vinegar to drink. Read John 19:28-30.

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life to give us eternal life. **Read John 10:10-11.**

Sprinkle a little salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it and brush the rest into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin. **Read Luke 23:27.**

Add 1 cup sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him. Read Ps. 34:8 and John 3:16.

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 12 to 15 minutes until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus.

Read Isa. 1:18 and John 3:1-3.

Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto wax paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid. **Read Matt. 27:57-60.**

Put the cookie sheet in the oven, close the door and turn the oven OFF. Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed. **Read Matt. 27:65-66.**

NOW GO TO BED! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed. Read John 16:20 and 22.


On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty. **Read Matt. 28:1-9**





Adventure Club Council recommendation accepted to return \$100,000 to the church finance team that was put in contingency fund for any needed recovery of ministry from Covid.

Finance Team recommendation accepted to place \$150,000 from the general operating fund into a new Land Fund line item. Recommendation also received to place \$25,000 to begin Phase 2 building fund for new Worship Center.

Community Ministry Study Team recommendation accepted to continue to lease The Warehouse after the new facility is finished to develop a Community Ministry Center. The cost for one year is rent/utilities (\$24,000) and director (\$20,800). The church has money in a designated fund account to pay for the year. The Community Ministry Center study team included Dale Kramer, Linda Otterback, Cecil Jones, Chet Miller, Dixie Taylor, and Mary Wyatt.

Personnel team recommendation approved for a revised employee handbook. Recommendation also accepted to approve 2023 Minister Housing allowance.
