God's Blessing of Making Disciples

How does God resource His church for strength of mission, purpose, and Biblical unity? In the previous four months' articles, we have briefly recognized God's blessing and our equipping through the Bible, Christian fellowship, worship and serving. Next, we receive God's blessing through making disciples who make disciples. We know this spiritual discipline or habit as discipleship.

Through SBC's recent "Every Church on Mission" discipleship class, we discovered that while the church teaches Bible stories and some doctrine, few classes are involved in actual training for doing the gospel, being the gospel, and telling the gospel. The misnomer was that SBC, and many churches, have made disciples by only teaching the Bible. We need to be trained. We need to practice. We need to go, serve, tell, share, give, and pray. Go, into all the world making disciples (Matthew 28:19-20) is written in the essence of discipling and mentoring others as you are going. It's like the old concept of "on the job training."

One truth we can embrace is that we "train" disciples in church and home to go into the world to "make" disciples. Training topics for spiritual formation include:

* Praying

- * Kingdom Missions
- * Interpret the Bible
- * Christian Leadership
- * Gospel Conversation
- * Biblical Manhood
- * Defending the Gospel * Biblical Womanhood
- * Humble Service.
- * New Christian

We often relegate discipleship to a classroom or Bible study activity. The act of making disciples is not only gaining knowledge of biblical facts, but also taking the message of those truths from Jesus to an unbelieving world in a manner that draws others to Him. We can learn Bible stories and facts every week, and not be effective as a Christian or a church because we can't or won't apply that life of Christ daily in our world.

Who are you training, mentoring, and discipling? Is our staff teaching and preaching the practical implications of "how to live" the gospel in our world? Is your Sunday School class or small group Bible study training others to be missionaries to our world? How can we be more effective as a church? The old adage is "everyone needs a Paul and everyone needs a Timothy." We all need to be mentored, and we all need to mentor others. Pray that God will help us improve in this vital area of Christian life.

Our church will become far more effective for His kingdom when we realize and actualize the fact that God teaches us to Make Disciples who Make Disciples. This IS the resource of being light and salt in the world. This is the being of the gospel, the dining of the gospel, and the telling of the gospel! It is the resource of Christ in Us the Hope of Glory! We are trained and disciplined to walk in the Spirit and live the fruit of the Spirit every day. What a blessing and what a resource we are to one another.

<u>Through your giving, SBC supports Sunrise Children's Services.</u> Sunrise has been at the forefront in the fight to protect Kentucky's children since 1869.

At the close of the Civil War, families in Kentucky were left devastated. As a border state with torn loyalties, Kentucky saw families split and broken by the conflict. Death, sickness, and the poverty that followed left many children orphaned with no one to care for them. Since their beginnings as a ministry, Sunrise continues to be fueled by a faithful dedication to God's call for His people to be the hands and feet of Jesus in caring for innocent children. They have helped to transform thousands of lives over the years, and your continued support enables them to make a difference in lives today and for years to come.

Today, Sunrise is a home for children who have been abused and neglected — children whose lives have been scarred by unspeakable physical, sexual, and emotional abuse — and who have been removed from their homes. From the president of the organization down to the direct care staff, their

goal every day is to provide a place of refuge, of hope, of love, and of healing to these children whose lives have been devastated. For these children, Sunrise is a place where they can begin to feel safe, a place where they encounter adults who give unconditional love, and a place where they can begin to learn that the world can be a good place.

Foster Parents Needed

Are you interested in becoming a foster parent in Kentucky through Sunrise Children's Services? On any given day, there are more than 400,000 children in foster care in the United States. Despite the common perception that the majority of children in foster care are very young, the average age of a child in care is around 8-9 years old.

In 2016, more than 65,000 children who were living in foster care and waiting to be adopted, had their biological parental rights permanently terminated. And, while states should work rapidly to find safe, permanent homes, children spend an average of nearly two years waiting to be

The orphanage has proven to be a light on a hill as reports are coming in from Malindi regarding the deaths of hundreds from cults in the area. Education is the key to changing lives. With this in mind, Nathan would like to begin a new program which would benefit both the Rescue Center and the community. He would like to introduce drip irrigation and the use of shade netting/greenhouses. Both would be used to increase food production and allow the Center to

begin selling food AND require them to purchase less. Community families would also benefit from learning how to produce their own food. Projected costs for both projects is a little less than \$9,000.

Please continue in prayer for Nathan and Lillian Osiemo. Their son Tyler Frank was tragically murdered while at University as a 3rd year medical student. Additionally, Lillian has become ill. They have two other collegeaged children, Russel and Elvera who are deeply grieving the loss of their brother.

Deacon/Yokefellow Selection Procedure

Nominations will take place through Sunday, June 4

Biblical & Church Requirements for Deacons and Yokefellows:

- All nominees should be in accord with 1Timothy 3:8-13.
- Be involved in Sunday School and Worship regularly.
- Must be a church member for one year.
- Must exhibit growth in giving to a minimum of a tithe.
- Regularly attend deacon meetings and deacon ministry events. Deacons currently meet the first Sunday of every other month at 4pm.
- Deacons commit to serving a term of three years and then must rotate off for at least one year.

Nomination Requirements:

- To be nominated, deacon nominees must be ordained or have served one year as a yokefellow.
- You may not nominate your own family members.
- You must be a member to submit a nomination.

Each nominated person must strive to adhere to the expectations of the Bible and the church. For example, a deacon must be a regular attender of Sunday School.

Yokefellows:

- Serve in a mentoring role for one year.
- Have the same nomination requirements and expectations as deacons.
- Nominations can be made for any individual within the church membership.
- Are not required to be ordained or to have served in the past.

Deacon/Yokefellow Process:

- Each deacon/yokefellow nominee will be contacted by the leadership to notify of the nomination.
- An Affirmation Team will interview those that have been nominated to be a deacon/yokefellow. Notification will then be made to our church of those who meet the biblical and church expectations. Questionnaires will need to be completed by all those who are nominated to be a deacon/yokefellow.
- If interested, leadership will schedule an appointment to discuss biblical and church expectations and review the deacon ministry plan.

** Please note:

- ⇒ All nomination forms and ballots must be printed **legibly**, otherwise they will be discarded.
- ⇒ Nomination forms can given to a staff member or placed in the offering plate.
- ⇒ Parents of children who are members, please consider the magnitude of this process and potential implication upon the outcome when deciding whether or not to allow your children to vote. **Children must be 16 years of age to vote.**
- ⇒ Members may nominate up to two deacons and two yokefellows.

Please do <u>NOT</u> nominate these deacons who are ineligible for nomination because they are currently serving: Marilyn Rhoads, Edith McGowan, Cindy Childers, Brent White, Lowell Ashby, Nathan Sangster, Matt Maxwell, Mike Moore, Dale Kramer

The following yokefellows are eligible for nomination after completing a one-year training: Debbie Willman, Roy Shuler, Jack Nicholson, Richard Walker.





What would you tell potential visitors to your class? We are a unique group. We show our love for one another; "When one hurts, we all hurt, when one rejoices, we all rejoice!"We love, care for, pray, cry, laugh together often and bond through activities and missions. There is real JOY in being with each other and laughing together!




