


Mijomboni Rescue Center



Thanksgiving and Christmas Report

- The Women's Bunco Group sponsored a child at the Mjomboni Rescue Center.
- Our Church Family Thanksgiving meal was very well attended! Our deacons not only prepared and served the meal, but took meals to 31 individuals who were either homebound or ill. We gave 38 quest families complimentary tickets to the meal.
- We hope you enjoyed the Advent devotionals. We gave out over 175 in worship and sent 30 to our homebound and those who are unable to attend in person.
- Our Toy Store served 123 families and 375 children this year.
- Our church family adopted 23 children for whom Christmas gifts were provided.

By the Numbers

Discipleship

In 2023 our coed discipleship classes had a total of 164 different people attend. Fifty-nine of those were first-timers in a class and ten of them were from the community. Our Tuesday men's class which began in the fall had thirteen members, three of which are first-time attenders. Our women's ministry had 50 different ladies attend, three of which were first timers and four of which came from the community.

Fellowship

In 2023 our women's fellowship, which includes Bunco, Spring Tea, and the Christmas Party had 96 different women involved. Twenty-eight of those were from the community and twenty-eight attended an event for the first time.

Seniors

107 senior adults were invited to various events including Goodtime Travelers Adult Day Trips, Classic Worship, the Spring Sing-A-Long, and the Christmas Party. Fifty-six seniors attended at least one event. That means that fifty-one of you are missing out on some good eating and good fellowship!
