Did you know that ALC provides more than pregnancy tests and ultrasounds? They offer unique services to each mother and father that reaches out to them; to choose life, to help reunite them with their children, or simply support them to become the best parents they can be. A mom may need parenting classes; a dad may need one-on-one peer counseling.

Last year ALC served 141 positive pregnancy cases of which 98 chose to carry their child and chose life! They provided 5000 services to women and families in crisis pregnancies through Empowering Parenting classes, Bible Study Group, Peer Counseling and ESL. During the holidays the Joy of Giving Christmas program served 165 children and parents and gave our 55 food boxes.

Kitchen Policy

- a. Wash, dry, and return all dishes and cookware to proper locations.
- b. Clean oven, sink, and counter tops AND microwave.
- c. Remove wet and soiled towels and return clean items within 7 days.
- d. Empty trash cans, and put new liners in. Take trash bags to dumpster.
- e. Sweep and mop kitchen floor.
- f. Turn off coffee pots and lights.

g. Do not use disposable kitchen supplies (cups, paper plates, napkins, etc.) as they have been purchased by specific teams for their event use.

h. DO NOT leave food or plates etc. from your function in the refrigerator or on the counter-tops.

i. For church-related events, all tables should be reset to their original places. j. Items regularly stored in the refrigerator belong to the Adventure Club staff. Please do not remove their drinks or lunches.

Hymns We Love **Steve and Pippa Cramer**



Darryl H. Wilson began serving as a state missionary for the Kentucky Baptist Convention in September 1997. As Sunday School & Discipleship Consultant, he provides Sunday School, discipleship, senior adult, and small group training and consultations for 2,361 Kentucky Baptist churches and 66 associations. Darryl has also taught at Rockbridge Seminary, The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, and Boyce College.



Darryl grew up in Nashville, Tennessee, receiving the Bachelor of Arts degree from Belmont University in 1982. He graduated from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville in 1985 with the Master of Divinity in Christian Education degree and in 2003 with the Doctor of Education degree.

Over the years, Darryl served five Baptist churches as Minister of Education. He came to the convention from Eastwood in Bowling Green, Kentucky. In addition to Eastwood, he served the Kentucky churches of Alton in Lawrenceburg, Living Hope in Bowling Green, and Third in Owensboro as well as First in Pendleton, South Carolina. During those years, Darryl was also active in associational and state Sunday School work. In recent years, he has provided pulpit supply and interims for many churches.

Since 1984, Darryl has been married to Yvonne (*pronounced Ya-vonne*) Wilson of Lawrenceburg. Yvonne received the Bachelor of Science in Accounting degree from the University of Kentucky in 1984. Since graduating, she has held various accounting and teaching positions. She has been a middle school algebra teacher at Whitefield Academy in Louisville since 1998. Their oldest son, Jonathan, is 35 years old and married to Ashley. They are parents of Jonathan (age 6) and Ruby (age 3). Jordan is 34 years old and married to Savannah. They are parents of Avery (age 7), Hazel (age 5), Brooks (age 3), Harper (age 1), and a fifth child due in April.
